It is extremely important that students carefully select classes they wish to take for both semesters! Teachers are hired and the number of sections created are based on these selections.

The only opportunity to change classes that are selected will be after the mail-in registration process during an appointment with a counselor. At that time changes will be made for the following reasons ONLY:

If a student:

- *Took a class in summer school and passed*
- *Has less than 6 classes*
- *Has a study hall and needs a class*
- *Is not scheduled in a class that was failed last year*
- *Is not scheduled for a required academic class/graduation requirement*

❖ **All schedule changes require a parent signature on a "Drop/Add" form. Schedule changes over the phone, by fax, or by email will not be accepted.**

Registration Form (Green)

- Complete name, address, phone #, 6-digit student number, and birthdate. **PLEASE USE BLUE OR BLACK INK AND PRINT INFORMATION LEGIBLY!**
- Per Board policy, **STUDENTS MUST BE ENROLLED IN A MINIMUM OF FOUR CLASSES** each semester. A \$150.00 cost will be assessed each semester if more than six courses are selected. "A" period students must have their own transportation.
- *Math, Science, English, and World Languages second year and above* must have a **teacher signature** for approval.
- AA Sports must have a **coach's** signature.
- Be sure to select an alternate course for each elective selected. *If your elective is not available or there is a conflict in your schedule, your second choice will be selected.*
- **Release periods must be scheduled at the beginning or end of the student's day.** Release periods during the student's school day are not permitted.
- Student aides for teachers must have prior approval and teacher signature on registration form before registration forms are collected. Students will initially be placed in a study hall. Assignment to a teacher will be made at a later date.
- **Parent/guardian must sign** completed registration form.

Additional Course Information

AP, HONORS, DUAL ENROLLMENT - Students must obtain approval for any weighted courses *prior to* returning registration documents.

COURSES REQUIRING PREREQUISITES - Any course that requires a prerequisite must have a teacher signature. Example: Advanced Guitar (MU31) has a prerequisite of MU29 and MU30.

BAND - Marching Band class meets daily during ‘A’ hour. Marching Band earns .33 credit. Two semesters of MU81 (2/3 credit) may substitute for 1/2 credit of the PE requirement. For further information contact cvwedge@mpsaz.org.

FLAG LINE - All students interested in flag line should contact Mr. Wedge prior to the end of the current school year @ cvwedge@mpsaz.org.

PE/DANCE - PE70, PE71, PE72, and PE75 are co-educational. Both males and females are invited to enroll in a dance class. Auditions are required for all levels of dance except beginning (PE70). PE70, PE71, PE72, and PE75 may be

taken for either a PE credit or for a Fine Art credit (once 1.0 of PE credit is met). Both credits are required for graduation. Any PE prefix class may be repeated for credit.

SCIENCE - Please refer to the RMHS Science course flowchart and ask a science teacher to help select an appropriate science course. College bound students should take Biology (SC49) or Applied Biological Systems (AG30), Chemistry (SC71), and Physics (SC81).

JROTC - MS35 Special Teams, can count toward PE credit.

NCAA REQUIREMENTS - Make an appointment with a counselor to review NCAA procedures. Algebra I, Spanish I and Essential Elements of Science taken in the 8th grade are eligible for consideration toward the 16 core classes for Division I or the 14 cores classes for Division II.

EAST VALLEY INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY (EVIT) - students should designate 3 periods on the registration form as either EVIT a.m. or EVIT p.m. Students who register for EVIT must keep that schedule for one semester. A bus to and from EVIT is provided.

SENIOR CO-OP CLASSES - must have written approval from teacher and/or department. Permanent assignments will be made after interviews and screening process is completed. **Students must have accumulated 15 credits as of May 22, 2008 before they can enroll in a co-op class.** Seniors who wish to register for these classes must have written approval from the teacher listed.
